This report is a summary of the actions taken by Buckden Parish Council over the last year. We also report our activities through monthly meetings, our website, articles in The Roundabout and via Parish Council notice boards in the village. There is a public forum at the start of every Parish Council meeting when we welcome you to put forward your views or raise concerns.

Two areas of major concern to residents over the past year have been the proposed closure of Buckden Library and the two planning applications from Buckden Landfill Site. Your Parish Council took action on these, and many more, issues (see below).

Looking forward, the Parish Council hopes that all residents enjoy the Jubilee and Olympic celebrations in this special year.



WHAT BUCKDEN PARISH COUNCIL DID IN 2011/12

The Parish Council was involved in many aspects of village life including:

- Library Working with Cambridgeshire Libraries, organised a questionnaire regarding the proposed closure of Buckden Library, currently working to establish a Library Support Volunteers' Group.
- Planning 37 planning applications were considered and the PC gave recommendations to Huntingdonshire District Council, including refusals.
- Environment saved Parish Council funding by organising our own grass cutting, planted trees and shrubs on the Village Recreation Ground and, with school children, on the school playing field; secured improvements to the two subways.
 Funded the Christmas lights in the High Street and at Hunts End.
- Quality Council worked towards gaining *Quality Council* status and established the Buckden PC website at www.buckdenparishcouncil.org.uk
- Footpaths Councillors walked all footpaths in the Parish; worked with County Council to ensure they are passable; continued efforts to widen scope of Rights of Way in local area.
- Links with wider community the Parish Council participated in meetings with, and responded to, a variety of requests for information and views from the following: the Cambridgeshire Constabulary, Huntingdonshire District Council, Cambridgeshire County Council, Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Association of Local Councils. The Parish Council is liaising with the Steering Committee to develop the Village Plan for Buckden and is supporting Buckden's Olympic Weekend.
- Cemetery administered the cemetery and tested the soil (found suitable) for a
 possible future extension adjacent to the Buckden Surgery.
- Allotments administered the allotments, gave prizes for best kept allotment.
- Donations made donations to the up-keep of the Village Playing Field and several charities with Buckden connections, including the Citizen's Advice Bureau, Children's Reading Week and the Cambridgeshire Police Shrievalty Trust.
- Roads actively involved in discussions about future developments of the A14,
 A1 and other local roads.

SOME CURRENT PROJECTS

Quality Council—We are working towards achieving Quality Council status. Once achieved, this will help the Council to represent the village more effectively, and will make it easier for us to tap into some sources of external funding. This is a long-term project that requires the Council to demonstrate that it meets a number of criteria across a range of topics. We are making good progress in all areas and we will be ready to apply for Quality Council status as soon as we meet the requirement for having a minimum number of elected councillors, immediately after the next Parish Council election.

Buckden Village Plan—We have initiated the process to develop and publish a Village Plan which will reflect the aspirations and desires of Buckden residents across a wide range of topics. The work to develop the Plan is being managed by a Steering Group independent of the Parish Council. During the summer of 2012, residents will be asked to complete a survey, and the Steering Group will base the Plan on the findings of the survey. The plan will be drafted and handed over to the Parish Council and should be adopted in 2013.

The Localism Bill— We are currently assessing what the new central government bill will mean for us. Our reading so far is that it will bring us greater power, but also great responsibilities, and we anticipate that the area of Planning will be significantly affected. As with all aspects of our work, we will report action via our usual routes.

Environment – We are working with Southoe and Buckden Scouts to clear undergrowth and tidy the area of the valley, adjacent to the Village Hall field.


Library—We are working with Cambridgeshire Libraries to develop a Volunteers' Group to support the library staff and, we hope, enable greater use of this facility.

WORK AND ROLE OF THE BUCKDEN PARISH COUNCIL

The work of the Buckden Parish Council falls into two areas. Firstly, our role is to represent you on issues affecting the community to District, County and Central Government. Secondly, we carry out the following work within the parish:

- Maintenance of open spaces at: the cemetery, the valley area, St Mary's Churchyard, The Green, the Millennium Hall car park.
- On behalf of the Council: Verge cutting, within village and to Buckden Marina.
- Provide and administer the allotments and the cemetery in Buckden.
- Provide and maintain bus shelters, seats, parish notice boards, dog waste bins, litter bins and salt bins at various locations.
- Comment on, but not decide on, all planning applications within the parish.
- Contribute financially to The Roundabout and support the editor and all volunteers.
- Monitor footpaths; monitor and plant trees and shrubs within public areas; monitor road safety issues.
- Maintain the Buckden Parish Council website, found at www.buckdenparishcouncil.org.uk
- Nominate representatives on the following: Buckden Parochial Charities, Buckden Quarry Liaison Group, Buckden Village Hall Trust, Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Association of Local Councils, St Neots Neighbourhood
- Organise and fund the Christmas lights on the High St
